2. 39th SABC DIRECTORS REPORT (May 2022 to April 30, 2023)

Forward

Our 38th Annual General Meeting & Conference was conducted on-line last year via Zoom on October 22, 2022. Those listed as Directors were elected by acclamation. Kelly Grant and Amyn Rajan joined our board and SABC thanked and acknowledged all the work that Tiasha Burch and Jeff Gammon have done for SABC over the years. Guest speakers included Dr. Wilson and Mandeep Dhinsda of the BC Lung Transplant Program along with recipients Kathryn O'Neil, Beth Miller and Cecille Soriano. Brett Thombs gave us an update on SPIN.

SABC Research Project

Work on the SABC-sponsored Research Program continues with the aim of identifying biomarkers specific to people who have pulmonary fibrosis caused by systemic sclerosis. This research program is creating a firm foundation for intensive research to control lung and skin damage in patients with scleroderma and lung damage in patients with Idiopathic Pulmonary Fibrosis (IPF). Being able to distinguish between pulmonary fibrosis that is idiopathic (of various or unknown origin) or the result of scleroderma, will allow medical professionals to provide patients with an accurate diagnosis.

Identifying reliable biomarkers also provides an opportunity to develop a functional cure; an ongoing treatment that corrects and prevents the disease from continuing to damage the affected organs (in this case, lungs).

Financial Report

For fiscal year 2022-2023 (May 1, 2022, to April 30, 2023), revenue consisted of \$517,491.36 with expenditures of \$148,932.53 for a net increase of \$368,558.83. Major disbursements included a research contribution of \$107,723.09 to St. Paul's Foundation, \$10,000 for the Canadian Scleroderma Research Group – Stem Cell Research and \$5000 for Scleroderma Patient-centered Intervention Network (SPIN).

In an effort of providing more stable long-term funding for scleroderma research, a new endowment fund (Joan Kelly Endowment) was also established this year. The fund was seeded with \$372,000 from three dedicated donations from revenue. All future annual revenue from investment of the fund will be distributed to scleroderma research projects in the following year.

Two other funds were also established this year. The Lihong Memorial Scholarship fund was established for educational support for medical students who are focusing their studies in or pursuing research in arthritis (rheumatology), heart (cardiology), lung (pulmonology) or kidney (nephrology) - all areas of scleroderma involvement. The fund had \$2,865 at the end of April. The Joan Kelly Community fund was established to provide financial assistance for patients of scleroderma who may need help as part of the challenges of living with scleroderma. The fund had \$3,858.68 at the end of April.

As of April 30, 2023, SABC had \$499,974.45 in total cash and investments (including amounts from Operating, Endowment, Community and Scholarship funds).

Raising Funds & Awareness

2022 Moving to Cure Scleroderma: A cheque for \$102,723.09 was presented to the St. Paul's Foundation to support the SABC Research Program. Five teams participated in June 2022, helping us surpass our goal: Scleroderma Ride for Research – Vancouver \$65,723.50, Moving to Cure Anywhere in BC - \$9,370, Kamloops - \$7,700.49 Victoria - \$11,402.20 and Surrey - \$8,466.90.

In 2022 we had the following sponsors: Global BC, Park Insurance, Save on Foods, C-Lovers, Out of the Blue Designs, MPERO 4 Entertainment & Pratt Pharmacy

SABC members Valerie Doyon and Chelsea Fitzpatrick created a fantastic YouTube video showing the support we received across the province.

In addition, SABC donated to the following: \$5,000 to the St. Paul's Foundation – SABC Research Project, \$5,000 to the Jewish General Hospital Foundation -Lady Davis Institute – SPIN, and \$10,000 to the Canadian Scleroderma Research Group – Stem Cell Research.

Educational Days

SABC also hosted 3 successful educational webinars: September 13, 2022 Pain Management with Dr. Micah Burns of ChangePain Clinic - Vancouver, January 21, 2023 Yoga for Scleroderma and April 5, 2023 Calcinosis and Hand Restrictions with Dr. Justyn Lufty.

Communications

We continue to produce our semi-annual magazine, *The Bulletin*, with grants from both Janssen and Boehringer Ingelheim. These magazines were not only sent to our members but to donors and rheumatologists.

As well, we continue to share member-specific news and tips twice a year with the newsletter, Sclerodata.

Like all websites, they are ever-changing. We are pleased to share that the major changes to our website have been done and now it's so much easier to find our up-to-date content.

We continue to increase our presence on social media with Instagram, Twitter (X), and Facebook.

President's comments

Once again, 2022/23 has been an interesting year. Although Covid still lurks among us, I have to say it was certainly wonderful, with our safety measures in place, to successfully conduct the June Awareness ride and walks in-person this June.

Being on the SABC Board keeps me very busy but it is so rewarding because we have such a wonderful community. I want to thank our Board members for their hard work and for continuing to make our association such a success.
